

Key Features of a Play Script

Character List	a character list introduces all the different characters
Act	these are sections of the play that detail different parts of the story
Scene	these are like book chapters that split up the action, a new scene usually means a new setting.
Setting Description	this is used to help actors imagine their environment
Dialogue	the words spoken by characters in drama scripts are known as dialogue
Stage Directions	tell actors what to do or how to act while reading a particular piece of dialogue
Narrator	these are characters which explain what is going on in the story for the benefit of the audience
colon	colon (:) is a punctuation mark consisting of two equally sized dots centered on the same vertical line
