Science: Electricity

electricity: the flow of an electric current or charge through a material, e.g. from a. Power sources through appliances.

battery: a device that stores electrical energy as a chemical

circuit: a pathway that electricity can flow around. It includes wires and power supply and include bulbs, switches or buzzers.


appliances: a piece of equipment or device designed to perform a particular job, e.g. a washing machine or a mobile phone.

electrical circuit: a complete route which an electric current can flow around.

cell: a device used to generate electricity. A battery is an example of a cell.

insulator: a material that does not let electricity pass through it

conductor: a material that lets electricity pass through it easily.

What and where is Europe?

Europe: a continent located in the Northern Hemisphere.

Continent: a large area of land with many countries, e.g. North America, Africa, Europe.

Northern hemisphere: a half of the earth that lies north of equator.

Equator: an imaginary circle around the earth everywhere equally distant from the north pole and the south pole

Physical features: Natural features of the UK, e.g. rivers, coasts

Human features: Human made features, e.g. canals, buildings.
