The Primary PE and Sports Premium (PPSP) is provided to schools by the Department for Education in order to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of primary-aged pupils and to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles.

In 2020-2021 we continued to receive the Primary Premium Sports Grant (PPSG) funding for PE and Sport as follows:

Pupils were able to participate more widely in a range of outdoor adventure / sports activities. This also raised the awareness of pupils and their parents regarding wider sports participation. Although the KS2 residential was unable to take place due to COVID-19 restrictions, the range of adventurous activities provided has acted as a precursor for parents to allow their children to participate in the annual outdoor / residential at the end of KS2 (whereas some parents display anxieties about their children taking part in such activities ordinarily).

We will build upon this through curriculum activities throughout the year. To enable the ongoing use of water bottles, we will source replaceable caps that can be provided to pupils on an annual / needs basis.	All pupils have been provided with water bottles and are actively encouraged to drink water. A system is in place to ensure water bottles are filled daily. Curriculum links will be maintained during the following curriculum year to ensure pupils are continually encouraged to remain hydrated with fresh water.

To ensure sustainability, play leaders have been recruited from within the pupil population. Play leaders will act as ambassadors for the promotion of healthy lifestyles to encourage their peers to engage with active play.	Although COVID-19 caused challenges with space constraints due to social-distancing, the additional equipment has made a noticeable difference with pupils being actively engaged during play / lunch times. The addition of play leaders has been beneficial as this encourages pupils to remain active and engaged.

Swimming at the end of KS2, 2020/21

Swimming is part of the national curriculum and is widely regarded as one of the most effective forms of exercise. Swimming helps to build strength and endurance and improve cardiovascular fitness.

By the end of KS2, we aim to ensure that all of our pupils are strong and confident swimmers who understand water safety. The information below sets out the progress we have made in teaching our pupils to swim and stay safe in water-based environments.
