

#### Poetry, songs and rhyme


A poem is made up of words and some of the words rhyme. Rhyming words have the same sound for example pat, sat, mat.

#### Non - fiction Information text

A non - fiction text gives you information and facts.



A non - fiction text has a title which tells you what you will be reading about. Some non- fiction texts include pictures with captions. A caption labels parts of a picture to tell you the name or give you details about the picture.

#### **Key vocabulary:**

setting - where a story takes place

plot - what happens in a story

characters - who is in the story

prediction - making a guess

verb - an action word for example run, cut, stick

**poem** - a poem is made up of words and some words rhyme

Capital letters are used at the start of sentences. They are also used for names or people, places and days of the week. Full stops are used at the end of each sentence.

Question marks are used at the end of a question.
