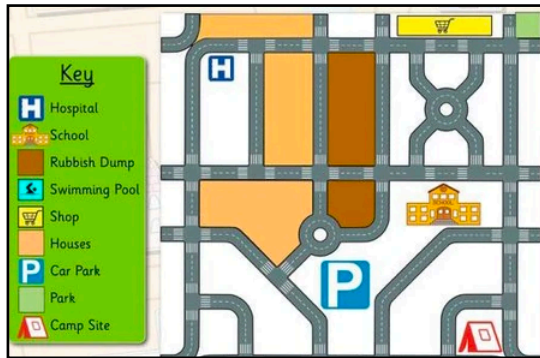
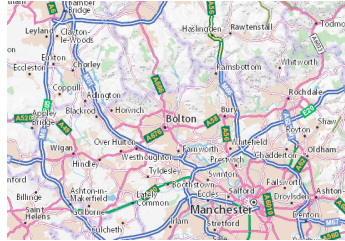

The Place Where I Live

Geography

- The town that we live in is Bolton.
- Bolton is in England which is part of the United Kingdom.
- Our local area has a shopping centre, library, museum and town hall.
- We have a police station and a fire station.
- We have local parks such as Queens Park which was opened in 1866.



Maps give us information about places. They tell us where places are and help us to identify where things are located.

A map uses symbols to show where these places are. These symbols are explained in a key.

Science

All living things reproduce and have offspring.

Some animals give birth to live young. Their offspring normally look like them when they are born.



Other animals have offspring which do not look like them for example fish and amphibians.



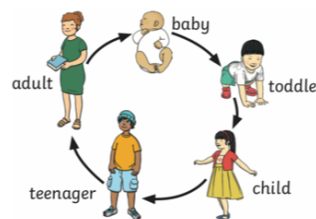
Some animals lay eggs which hatch into live young. This young then develops in to an adult. When these eggs hatch some animals look like their adult, for example, birds and reptiles.
