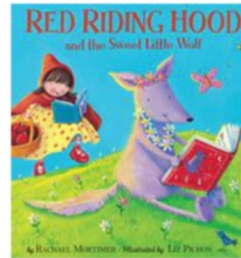
Sweet Little Wolf loves flowers and fairy tales, and she doesn't want to grow up to be big and bad.

Key Word	Definition
adverb of time	This tells us when an action happened but also for how long and how often, for example: first, next, after that.
imperative verb	This tells someone to do something, so the sentence becomes an order or a command, for example: fold, cut, jump.
