



Evaluation of Primary PE and Sports Premium (PPSP) - Strategy for 2022-23

The Primary PE and Sports Premium (PPSP) is provided to schools by the Department for Education in order to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of primary-aged pupils and to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles.

In 2022-2023 we continued to receive the Primary Premium Sports Grant (PPSG) funding for PE and sport as follows:

Follow-up through staff questionnaires lesson drop-ins and pupil-conferencing to ensure sustainability.</p>	<p>Effective use of BRCT to up-skill our staff. Questionnaires used to evaluate the developmental needs / progress of staff members that deliver PE. At the start of the year: 55% (6 out of 11) of the staff who completed the questionnaire, stated that being given the opportunity to work in partnership had increased their initial confidence to teach high quality PE lessons. With a further 27% (3) stating they weren't sure. 18% (2) stated they were not more confident. At the end of the year: 100% of staff who completed the questionnaire, stated they are more confident delivering PE now, than they were at the beginning of the year since working with BRCT. Pupils have access to higher quality teaching and learning through effective delivery of the PE curriculum. This has been evident from pupil conferencing where pupils stated they are</p>
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				<p>more active within their PE lessons and are only 'still' whilst being given new instructions or shown new 'things and skills'.</p> <p>Pupil attainment for 2022/34 ranges from 85% - 98% of pupils working at age related expectations for PE. (Years 1 - 6.) Whereas in the 2021/22 academic year, attainment levels ranged from 80% - 92%.</p> <p>Therefore, the use of BRCT has shown an improvement in the pupils' attainment.</p>
Additional swimming lessons (Years 4 and 5)	£13,085.29	Ensures additional opportunity to develop confident and competent swimming across all year groups from Year 2.	Partaking in a course of swimming lessons of 10 x 45 min lessons to have a long term impact on pupils' swimming ability.	<p>In the 2022/23 academic year, in Year 4 and 5 there were 6 pupils (10%) who could swim 25m front and back. This shows there has been an increase of 7 pupils (11.6%) this academic year due to the additional lessons. This is broken down into the year groups below.</p> <p><u>Year 5:</u> 5 pupils (8.3%) are able to swim 25m on their front and back.</p> <p><u>Year 4:</u></p>

				<p>8 pupils (13.3%) are able to swim 25m on their front and back.</p> <p>In order to increase this, part of the Sports Premium funding for the 2023/24 academic year will again be spent on 2 year groups to improve their swimming (Year 4 and 5) so that attainment in swimming is improved by the time they reach year 6.</p>

Staff have said they feel more comfortable teaching PE wearing the staff PE kit. Pupils can see the expectation (to wear the school's PE kit) is high and is met by adults too.</p>
