

### Nursery to Reception - how is it different?

Nursery and Reception are where your child's educational journey starts. We both follow the **Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS)** requirements to ensure they flourish from the very beginning.



#### **Curriculum:**

In Nursery, the structure of Early Years is a very child-centred one, with tailored learning areas and structured activities that run within a free-flowing timetable. This allows children to make their own choices about what they want to do and which items they play with. The zones are adjusted depending on the children's interests and are changed regularly to meet individual needs.

Our Reception classes are structured in line with our whole school's day. The work is planned and tailored to meet both the children's needs and the Early Years topics. The children work in small groups with the class teacher. Each child practices key skills throughout the day in line with the curriculum.

#### Routine

Nurseries work in three hour blocks that children access for between 15 and 30 hours a week. Children who have attended Nursery usually have the option of staying with them for a full day, a morning or an afternoon, with a lunchtime session being optional.



To enhance your child's learning we provide them with a knowledge organiser every half term. This includes:


- Key knowledge your child needs to learn;









Pupil learning is well-supported through direct instruction videos and learning activities on Showbie. This allows all learners to develop their vocabulary and access the curriculum effectively. An emphasis on recall and retrieval practice using Socrative quizzes enables our learners to embed key knowledge in their long term memory so that they can apply it fluently. The above also empowers parents to better support their childrens' learning.


#### Library Books:

At The Olive Tree Primary School, we encourage our children and young readers to make choices about what to read. The children have an opportunity to choose their own library book and take this home as part of their home reading.


This really empowers children, enabling even reluctant readers to make their own choices with what they read.

## Homework


Homework is usually issued to children on a Friday and must be completed by Thursday.



## iPads


The use of iPads is a key part of your child's learning - it forms a part of the school's vision and ethos.




## Personal Data
