



To enhance your child's learning we provide them with a knowledge organiser every half term. This includes:


- Key knowledge your child needs to learn;

Vocabulary Development

Learning new words is the key to unlocking a world of texts. To enable pupils to develop language, we encourage them to enhance their vocabulary bank; to support children in developing their vocabulary, pupils in Key Stage 2 now have access, via their own personal logins to an online platform called Bedrock Learning.


Completing around 20 minutes at home per week (less than 5 minutes a day) will really benefit your child, not only in reading, but in their writing as well.





Character Education

Character Education is the wider personal development of a child beyond the academic education they receive in school. It aims to instil in pupils a number of key characteristics and values such as resilience, honesty, motivation and humility, all of which will help them in their adult lives.

Children have a character development matrix which they use as a guide to evidence how they have achieved key characteristics. Over the next few weeks there will be a launch to remind children to continue with their portfolios.



Homework


Homework is usually issued to children on a Friday and must be completed by Wednesday.






Personal Data
